Pastor's Corner

Grounded | Based | Rooted

The Creed

"We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine, by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming" (Ephesians 4:14).

This week, I want to return to our walkthrough of the Mass and to resume where we left off in the Liturgy of the Word, having covered the Scripture readings and now moving into our profession of faith, which we call the Creed. Creed comes from the Latin word Credo, which means "I believe." It is a summary statement of our faith which keeps us united in belief and safe from the errors of heresy. Each Sunday, we recite the Nicene Creed, which dates back to 325 A.D. at the Council of Nicaea.

What we believe in matters so much because it shapes the direction of our life and the decisions we make. I've noticed that many of us are not particularly good about articulating what we believe, whether because we just haven't reflected on our core beliefs or because we have bought into the error of relativism, which is the belief that there are no absolute truths, because truth is relative to one's culture. Have you ever heard or said, "it doesn't matter what you believe or what church you go to so long as you are a good person and don't hurt anyone else"? That's an example of an erroneous, relativistic statement.

In contrast to relativism, when we recite the Creed at Mass, we profess faith in what God has revealed. This faith is both an intellectual assent to divine revelation as well as a personal adherence of our whole lives to God. When we recite the Creed, we are professing our core beliefs by which we seek to live our lives. Reciting the Creed grounds us and roots us in all that is good and true. It will inevitably conflict with mainstream beliefs, which are always shifting. We are called to courageously and unapologetically proclaim the truth as God has revealed it, who can neither deceive nor be deceived. Truth does not change, no matter how much we want it to. Do we really need to recite the Creed every Sunday? Absolutely! Why? Here are a few reasons...

- To renew our personal commitment to follow God on the path He has set for us.
- So that we shape our lives according to truth, not error; living in reality, not fantasy.
- To remind ourselves that we don't define reality and that we are not God.

What we have just heard in Scripture at length, we now recite briefly in the Creed, which takes us in a speedy fashion from the book of Genesis to the book of Revelation. What I find particularly beautiful about the Creed is how it reminds us that we are all part of an epic story, not some meaningless, unintelligible existence. It gives us our purpose in life and roots us in reality. If you are feeling aimless and confused, pray the Creed right now! See the big picture. See that you belong to a family. Do not be children, tossed about by random beliefs which are espoused by the world for a few years. Be rooted, grounded, and based in the truth of reality as God has revealed it. Let's pray the Creed this Sunday with renewed attention and fervor!

If you suspect a child is being abused or neglected, make a report to the **Kansas Department for Children** and Families Protection Report Center by calling (800) 922-5330.

Call law enforcement if the person is in immediate danger or injured.

If you or someone you know has been abused by a cleric, employee, or volunteer of any archdiocesan parish, school, or agency - regardless of when the abuse occurred — call the archdiocesan confidential report line at (913) 647-3051 or the Victim Care Advocate at (913) 298-9244 *AFTER* calling local law enforcement.
