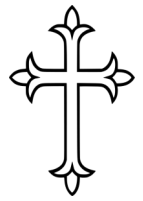


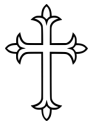
# Immaculate Conception Parish Saint Stanislaus Parish

To gain a partial indulgence, you must  
 perform with a contrite heart the act to  
 which the indulgence is attached. To gain  
 a plenary indulgence, you must perform.  
 The act, go to confession, receive Holy  
 Communion, and pray for the pope's inten-  
 tions. You must also be free from attach-  
 ment to sin. A plenary indulgence is the  
 COMPLETE remission of temporal punish-  
 ment. By visiting a cemetery during the  
 month of November to pray for the dead,  
 we can gain a plenary indulgence for a  
 soul in purgatory as long as we fulfill the  
 other conditions I just listed. Let's make  
 this a November focused on gaining  
 indulgences!

Dear Family,

Pastor's Corner

In this month of November, the Church  
 draws our attention to what is commonly called "the last things": death, judg-  
 ment, heaven and hell. This is most fitting because the time right before the  
 start of Advent (and the new Liturgical year) represent the end of time and  
 help us to reflect more deeply on our telos (our end, where we are headed).  
 Praying for the dead is one of the ways that we enter into this end of the year  
 reflection and that is partially why the Church encourages us to visit a cemetery  
 during November.

I wanted to briefly speak to you about what an indulgence is, because it  
 comes up a lot in November and because it has not been well taught or under-  
 stood. There is a lot of theology behind our belief in the efficacy of indulgences  
 and I can't break it all down in one short page, but let me quote the Catechism  
 of the Catholic Church for starters:

"An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal  
 punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven,  
 which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under  
 certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church  
 which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with  
 authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the  
 saints." [CCC 1471]

There are two types of punishment in this life: eternal and temporal.  
 Jesus Christ by his death on the cross has removed the eternal punishment due  
 to sin so that we are not condemned to hell, but the temporal effects of sin re-  
 main inasmuch as every sin has a consequence or a ripple effect, if you will.  
 When I break a window, the owner may forgive me, but the fact of the matter is  
 that the window is still shattered. This is where the "treasury of the merits of  
 Christ and the saints comes in. We can share in their overabundance of merito-  
 rious actions, much like a friend might help us by providing new glass to repair  
 the window.

So, there are different conditions that the church offers whereby we  
 can gain an indulgence for ourselves or for the souls in purgatory. Some are as  
 simple as making the sign of the cross devoutly. Others involve things like vis-  
 iting a cemetery. The end effect of an indulgence is that the time we or another  
 spend in purgatory due to the temporal punishment of sin is in a sense short-  
 ened. What a gift for a soul in purgatory and a great way to help ourselves grow  
 in holiness as well!!
