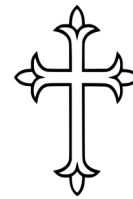


Immaculate Conception Parish

Pastor's Corner

We have entered back into Ordinary time, but remember that Ordinary time isn't "boring time," but is rather a season in the Church where instead of zooming in on a particular aspect of the Salvation History, **we** step back and appreciate the masterpiece of salvation as a whole – that Christ become man, died for us and has risen from the dead!

We have a plenty going on right now and I just wanted to touch on a few of these things:

You will notice an insert in the bulletin this week which addresses the topic of COVID-19 vaccines and the morality of such vaccines given their remote or not so remote connection to abortion-derived cell lines. I encourage you to read the Q & A insert and I am happy to attempt to field any concerns, questions, or thoughts you have on the matter.

As I mentioned this past weekend, the Archbishop's Call to Share is underway and you should be receiving envelopes in the mail asking for donations to this event, which supports to many good and praiseworthy causes that build up God's kingdom in our Archdiocese. We will also have an in-pew appeal in a few weeks, so you will have a chance to give at that time if you prefer.

This month is the anniversary of Roe vs Wade and is an important time to pray for an end to the evils of abortion, to pray for a greater respect for the sanctity of human life, and to also pray for all those who are suffering from the deep wound of having had an abortion, especially for their healing and repentance. Our Religious Ed. students received a bright pink sheet with a beautiful prayer of "spiritually adopting" an unborn child and praying for their protection. "To help stop the anti-life push around the world, the late Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen encouraged the spiritual adoption of an unborn child. This is done by praying that one particular but unknown child's life be spared abortion and be allowed to continue to live."

"Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of [baby's name] the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted who is in danger of abortion."

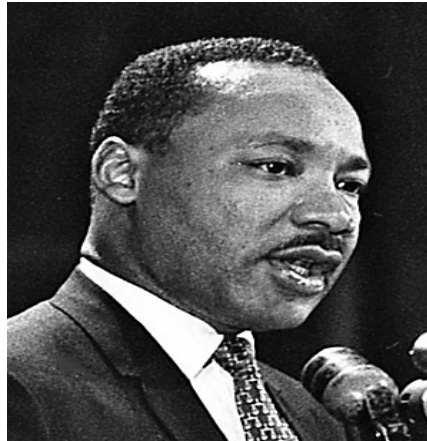
