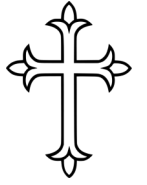

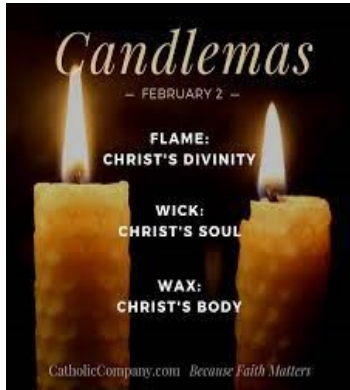

Pastor's Corner

The "Mini" Lent

As we approach the season of Lent which begins on Feb. 14th, it seems fitting to recall that the Church wants us to live out each Friday as a special sharing in the passion and death of Christ. I suppose we could call it a "mini" Lent consisting of exactly one day! Lent was never meant to be relegated to just one liturgical season in the Church calendar. In fact, Ordinary Time (the season we are in), is a celebration of the whole paschal mystery and indeed, the whole of Christian life. We don't zoom in on any one particular aspect of the mysteries of faith, but instead sample them all (in smaller quantities). So, with all of that as a backdrop, my question to you is this:

Are your Fridays any different than the other days of the week on a spiritual level?

Do I intentionally try to make it a sharing in the Passion of Christ? While there are a number of ways we can enter into the mystery of Christ's suffering and death and meditate on it more profoundly, the Church has always encouraged the singularly effective path of penance, particularly the penance of abstaining from meat. Wait, I thought we didn't have to do that penance/giving up meat on Fridays thing anymore (except for Lent)! Not exactly. Here is what the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has to say on the matter in a Pastoral Statement on Penance and Abstinence issued in 1966. I will share just a few parts of it for the sake of space. Emphasis on various parts are added by me.

1. Thus Sacred Scriptures declare our guilt to be universal; hence the universal obligation to that repentance which Peter, in his sermon on Pentecost, declared necessary for the forgiveness of sin (Acts 2:38). Hence, too, **the Church's constant recognition that all the faithful are required by divine law to do penance.** As from the fact of sin we Christians can claim no exception, so from the obligation to penance we can seek no exemption.

Christ Died for Our Salvation on Friday 18. Gratefully remembering this, Catholic peoples from time immemorial have set apart Friday for special penitential observance by which they gladly suffer with Christ that they may one day be glorified with Him. This is the heart of the tradition of abstinence from meat on Friday where that tradition has been observed in the holy Catholic Church.

19. Changing circumstances, including economic, dietary, and social elements, have made some of our people feel that **the renunciation of the eating of meat is not always and for everyone the most effective means of practicing penance.** Meat was once an exceptional form of food; now it is commonplace.

20. Accordingly, since **the spirit of penance primarily suggests that we discipline ourselves in that which we enjoy most,** to many in our day abstinence from meat no longer implies penance, while renunciation of other things would be more penitential.

21. For these and related reasons, the Catholic bishops of the United States, **far from downgrading the traditional penitential observance of Friday, and motivated precisely by the desire to give the spirit of penance greater vitality,** especially on Fridays, the day that Jesus died, urge our Catholic people henceforth to be guided by the following norms.

24. Among the works of voluntary self-denial and personal penance which we especially commend to our people for the future observance of Friday, even though we hereby terminate the traditional law of abstinence binding under pain of sin, as the sole prescribed means of observing Friday, we give first place to abstinence from flesh meat. We do so in the hope that the Catholic community will ordinarily continue to abstain from meat by free choice as formerly we did in obedience to Church law.

27. It would bring great glory to God and good to souls if Fridays found our people doing volunteer work in hospitals, visiting the sick, serving the needs of the aged and the lonely, instructing the young in the Faith, participating as Christians in community affairs, and meeting our obligations to our families, our friends, our neighbors, and our community, including our parishes, with a special zeal born of the desire to add the merit of penance to the other virtues exercised in good works born of living faith.

So, what is your Friday penance and/or work of mercy? Don't have one? Pray and ask God to show you what would best help you grow in a spirit of mortification, and self-denial. Whether it's meat, or a spiritual or corporal work of mercy, or giving up social media for the day, live out your Friday so that the splendor of the Sunday Feast rises with greater joy!
